
Activity 1 Collage of the Broads Animals

Get arty on a walk and collect lots of leaves, twigs, flowers and anything else natural that you find. Come home and use them to make a picture of the animals you can find in the Broads National Park.



When you next go for a walk, take paper and chalk or crayons with you and collect a series of bark rubbings of the various trees you pass. You'll be amazed at how different they all are.

Just hold your piece of paper against the trunk of the tree and rub away at it with the chalk, crayon or charcoal and you'll have a lovely impression of the bark on your paper.

Activity 3 Do a Leaf Rubbing or Two

Do exactly the same thing for leaf rubbings as you did for the bark rubbings. It might be best to collect the leaves and bring them home so that you can lay them on a table before covering with paper and rubbing them. Leaves with lots of veins are going to be your best ones.


